



The 56th Hong Kong Children's Health Competition, themed "親子FUN FUN動起來,至FIT快樂又夠 CHILL", took place on November 3, 2024. Co-organized annually by the Hong Kong Pediatric Foundation, the Hong Kong Paediatric Nursing Association, and the Boys' and Girls' Clubs Association of Hong Kong, this event encourages children to cultivate healthy living habits and maintain a fit body.

Targeting children aged 3 to 11, the competition featured a range of activities, including basic health examinations, physical fitness assessments, mental and physical intelligence tests, talent performances, and award ceremonies.

Participants underwent two rounds of health tests: the "Basic Health Checkup" and the "Vitality Test" to qualify for the finals. In addition to meeting height and weight ratios, children also had to complete vision and oral hygiene examinations, as well as simple language ability tests and various vitality challenges.

All finalists participated in a "Physical and Mental Intelligence Test", where they engaged in fun activities directed by occupational therapists. These activities assessed self-care skills, learning abilities, fine motor development, and bilateral coordination. The test also evaluated auditory memory, number sequencing, eye-tracking skills, visual perception, and reaction time through games, providing a comprehensive overview of each child's cognitive and perceptual abilities.

We firmly believe that children's health is crucial for their development, which is why our association is dedicated to organizing diverse activities that cater to their developmental needs. A healthy and supportive family environment significantly impacts children's growth. Through participating in engaging activities, children can achieve physical, mental, and spiritual well-being. Additionally, the event featured lectures from various professionals aimed at parents, enhancing their awareness of their children's holistic development through diverse experiences.

Asia Pacific Paediatric Nurses Association (APPNA) was formed by paediatric nurses in Asia Pacific Region in 2012, with the aim to work collaboratively to promote and advocate the health and development of children, to promote excellence in Paediatric Nurses and to deliver highest standard of care to the children, to promote excellence in Paediatric Nursing and to deliver highest standard of care to the children in Asia pacific region.

The Asia Pacific Paediatric Nurses Association comprises of 8 country/region member associations. Act as founding members APPNA, representatives from Hong Kong Paediatric Nurses Association attended the 8th Asia Pacific Paediatric Congress of Paediatric Nursing (APPCPN), which was held on 16-17 November 2024, Cebu, Philippines. This is the first time of physical attendance after the COVID-19 pandemic since 2020. The conference consisted of varies topics which ranges from community health to advance technology in paediatric nursing and the nursing participants also from difference Asia region including Australia, Singapore, Japan, Indonesia, Malysia, China, Hong Kong SAR and Philippines. Over 100 nurses joined together to update and share their nursing experience and achievement in child health.

APPNA also took the opportunity to hold the physical council meeting with the council members from different counties and areas. In the council meeting, the representatives of the membership of APPN were updated. Furthermore, the President of APPNA was handover the term from Ms KHOO Shi Min, Singapore, to Ms Balbina BORNEO President Elect. Ms BORNEO will lead the association in the coming three years. The secretariat general, the treasurer of APPNA and its the location of secretariat remained in Hong Kong from HKPNA. Ms Tang Sze Kit and Ms Peggy Lee takes up the role of the Secretariat of General and the Treasurer respectively. All the council members and conference participants joined together to support the change of the term and the certificate of appointment were issued in the meeting.

Nursing Education & Research in Paediatrics:

Effectiveness of "Five Minutes Talk" program to promote evidence-based practice among paediatric nurse in acute general paediatric ward

Background

Evidence-based practice (EBP) in nursing refers to the process through which nurses make clinical decisions grounded in the best available research evidence. However, the adoption of EBP in nursing practice remains relatively sluggish. Key barriers include insufficient time and a lack of support for promoting EBP. Therefore, it is essential to identify and implement appropriate strategies to enhance the integration of EBP within the nursing profession.

Method

All nurses in the acute general pediatric ward were recruited to participate in an evidence-based practice study focused on point-of-care initiatives, with facilitation support provided. A condensed presentation titled "Five Minutes Talk" was delivered to the nursing staff in the general pediatric ward. The "Taipei Evidence-Based Practice Questionnaire" (TEBPQ) was administered through a self-completed questionnaire. To assess the effectiveness of the evidence-based practice education, Cronbach's alpha was calculated.




Results

A total of 46 pediatric nurses participated in the "Five Minutes Talk" program & subsequently completed the TEBPQ.

Overall Cronbach's alpha was 0.84, indicating good internal consistency and suggests "Five Minutes Talk" program as effective in promoting evidence-based education.

Specifically, the Cronbach's alpha values were 0.81 for nurses with a Bachelor's degree (n=28, 60.9%), 0.88 for those with a post-registration specialty diploma (n=10, 21.7%), and 0.89 for nurses holding a Master's degree (n=8, 17.4%). These findings demonstrate that nurses with higher educational qualifications reported a greater effectiveness of the "Five Minutes Talk" program in evidence-based education.



Conclusions

"Five Minutes Talk" program was an appropriate and effective strategies in promoting EBP in acute general paediatric ward, and can increase the awareness of the need to establish and EBP culture among the general paediatrc ward.

The Asian Society for Paediatric Infectious Diseases (ASPID) is being held for the first time in Hong Kong. The theme of ACPID 2024 is "United, Work Together for Our Children" (團結、合作為兒童).

Globalization has led to an increase in cross-border activities, allowing infectious diseases to spread rapidly around the world. The experience of the COVID-19 pandemic over the past four years highlights the importance of global cooperation in exchanging the latest advancements in research and clinical practice, resulting in enhanced expertise in managing infectious diseases.

The conference covers a wide spectrum of topics, including advancements in patient management, public education, prevention strategies, and the prevalence of infectious disease across Asia. Its aim is to promote the best paediatric practices to improve health and protect the vulnerability of our paediatric population.

The conference is also focus on new vaccinations, such as Dengue, EV71, and Nirsevimab for RSV, which can target a wider variety of pathogens, thereby protecting populations from multiple infectious diseases that may have previously gone unaddressed.

However, the global rise in vaccine hesitancy has coincided with the resurgence of many childhood diseases, leading to the return of illness like measles in some countries. As paedaitric nurses, we must increase our cultural sensitivity and equip ourselves to communicate effectively the safety, efficacy, and risk-benefit of vaccines to parents.

To establish herd immunity, effectively combat infectious diseases, and protect the health of our children, we must strengthen immunization programs, enhance surveillance systems, and promote public health education.
